

Diabetes Center Expert Discusses Alarming Rise in Global Diabetes Cases

According to a new report issued by the World Health Organization ^[1] (WHO), the number of people living with diabetes worldwide has nearly quadrupled since 1980 to 422 million adults, with most living in developing countries.

In its first *Global report on diabetes* ^[2], WHO highlights the need to step up prevention and treatment of the disease – a goal that is shared by the Diabetes Center at UCSF.
